What do we mean by vision?

Here are how some organisations define vision:

“A vision statement looks forward and creates a mental image of the ideal state that the organisation wishes to achieve. It is inspirational and aspirational and should challenge employees.” SHRM

“The vision statement reflects where the company sees itself going. Best-practice organisations follow specific, measurable, action-based, reasonable and time-sensitive -- or SMART -- guidelines to write effective goal, mission and vision statements. Vision statements that are aligned with the SMART criteria can be developed into workable objectives for your company.” Small Business Chron

“A vision statement is sometimes thought of as a picture of your company in the future, but it’s much more than that. When creating a vision statement, you’re articulating your hopes and dreams for your business. Your vision statement is your inspiration, and it will serve as the framework for all your strategic planning.” The Balance Small Business

Mission:

Summarises the goals and values of your company

- SMART
- Performance
- Actionable parameters
- How you will get there
